ACADEMIC STANDARDS

POLICY 5.2.6

Satisfactory academic progress is essential to student success. To be in good academic standing, a minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 is required of all students enrolled in certificate, diploma and associate degree programs. At the end of each academic term, students who have not attained or maintained a GPA of 2.0 will be notified. The Student Records Office manages the academic alert, supervision, and probation process by notifying students of their academic status and academic advisors monitor students' progress toward goals.

- A. Academic Alert** – When a student's cumulative GPA first falls below a 2.0, the student will be placed on Academic Alert. Students will be notified to schedule an appointment with their academic advisor prior to registering for future semesters.

- B. Academic Supervision** – When a student's cumulative GPA remains below 2.0 for a second consecutive semester, the student will be placed on Academic Supervision and will not be able to register for future semesters until the student meets with their academic advisor. Students receiving financial aid, foundation scholarships, and veterans' benefits must also meet with a financial aid counselor to discuss eligibility.

- C. Academic Probation** – When a student's cumulative GPA remains below a 2.0 for additional consecutive semester, the student will be placed on Academic Probation and required to follow an academic recovery plan developed with their advisor. A probation hold will prevent students from registering for future semesters until the recovery plan is in place. Students will remain on probation until the cumulative GPA is 2.0 or above.

A student on academic probation may not hold elected office or serve on College committees and may be limited to participation in student clubs and student organizations.
